Summer Flute Ideas, or How to Stay in Shape

While everyone needs a vacation now and then, we all know how our fluting plummets during those times. Here are a few tips that will hopefully inspire you to pick up your flute regularly this summer:

- 1. Come to TFC's reading sessions!
- 2. Ask someone to play duets/trios/quartets with you.
- 3. Sign up for a lesson (or two, or more)
- 4. Attend classes at the NFA Convention in August
- 5. Purchase some play-along books and play along!
- 6. Attend a summer flute masterclass (if you don't know how to find one, ask me)
- 7. Set a goal for yourself, something you want to improve on and work on it regularly.
- 8. Try to play at least 15 minutes per day.
- 9. Find a recording of an excellent flutist playing some piece that you love. Buy the music and try to copy that sound.
- 10. Download the Acapella app and record yourself. This app easily makes audio and video recordings for pieces up to 9 different parts (well, you would have to play them all! And there is a trial version.)
- 11. If the play-along books are too fast for you, download The Amazing Slow Downer program to your computer. It's inexpensive. Once you import your accompaniment into the program, it has sliding bars so that you can change the speed of a piece OR the pitch level (so you can slow down the pieces to your comfort level, or play the same pieces at the original tempo on alto flute!).
- 12. Reorganize your sheet music, and vow to play through those old books at least once. They will still help you.
- 13. If you go out of town, stop at a music store and play test flutes. The new sounds you find can inspire you.
- 1 4. Set up a small ensemble performance for yourself and a few friends on your porch, in the park, or elsewhere.
- 15. If your flute is not sounding quite right, send it off for repair this summer. When it comes back, you will want to practice because it will be so much easier to play!
- 16. Splurge on new music! There a list of some helpful books on the next page.

Our flute club does not run on rehearsals alone. We need board members to help make decisions about what kinds of projects TFC will work towards. 




This concert is FREE! Please invite your family, friends and neighbors! There will be solos, duos, trios, small ensembles, and of course our flute choir.


